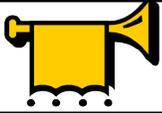

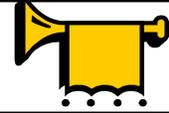

Transitional Ministerial Responsibilities

Before our interim minister, Libby Rollins, left to accept a call as an interim minister at another church, the Session approved a plan to ensure that our church can continue to meet our ministerial responsibilities through January 1, 2017. The Pastor Nomination Committee has been diligently and faithfully working to discern God's will in the selection of our next minister. Progress is being made and the PNC continues to request your prayers and support.

At this point, we have now fully implemented a temporary plan to meet our church's ministerial needs. This plan includes using two ordained Presbyterian ministers to share these duties.

The **Rev. Larry Ugarté** has been kind enough to agree to lead our Sunday worship services between October 2 and January 1. Larry has also agreed to moderate any congregational meetings during this period, if needed. A brief biographical sketch is included below.

The **Rev. Lou Ventura**, who is a former member, elder, and dear friend to all of us at SPC, has agreed to work with our Diaconate in meeting the pastoral care needs of our congregation. Lou will be on call for any medical emergencies, hospital visits, and home Communion. She is available to officiate at a funeral service, if needed. Lou has also agreed to moderate our Session meetings. Lou is currently the full-time minister at Franklin Presbyterian Church.

We are indeed blessed and grateful that these two individuals have been so willing to work with us during this period of transition. The agreements between our church and both of these individuals will continue until January 1, 2017. If more time is needed, there is an option to extend the agreements, provided all parties agree.

I ask that you keep them in your prayers as they assist us in our continuing efforts to serve our Lord.

Born and reared up in Dallas, Texas, Larry Ugarté holds a BA in Social Studies from SMU, an MSW from Pitt, and an MDiv from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. From 1964-1975, he served as an Unrestricted Line Officer in the Navy. Ordained by the Presbytery of Wabash Valley in 1979. Rev. Ugarté went on to serve as a Navy Chaplain, 1979-1988. He then served as Pastor of New Hope Presbyterian Church, Virginia Beach. In 2001, he was called as Pastor, First Lutheran Church of Portsmouth (ELCA), a call outside the bounds of the Presbytery. Pr. Ugarté is now Honorably Retired from both the ELCA Synod of Virginia and the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia. Nevertheless, he currently serves as Minister of Visitation at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church, Suffolk, and as Moderator of the Session at First Presbyterian Church of South Norfolk, Chesapeake. He is expected to be our Pulpit Supply through the end of December. Larry and his wife, Cynthia, live in Virginia Beach and are the proud parents of two adult children.

Church Flowers for Sunday Worship

- A "Flower Calendar Chart" is posted in the narthex. You may sign-up for a specific Sunday by writing your name next to that date.
- If you wish to give the flowers in "honor" or in "memory" of someone, please note that person's name. If you are recognizing a special event, please note that on the flower chart.
- **Janice Thomas**, a member of the Worship Ministry Team, will use this chart to place flower orders with Johnson's Gardens who will deliver the flowers to our church.
- Johnson's Gardens has agreed, at this time, to charge \$40.00 per arrangement. They will bill the church based upon the number of orders placed.

We ask that you provide the church with a check for \$40.00. Please make the check out to Suffolk Presbyterian Church and note on the check that it is for "worship service flowers." The check can be placed in the offering plate or given to **Laura Farmer**, our church administrative assistant.


