From the Pastor

I love hearing a good story. There is nothing better than curling up to a favorite book. As a child my mother spent hours reading to me. My imagination wandered as listened to nursery rhymes. It got to the point where I could recite them by heart. Story time became a special time for momma and me. It taught me to listen and dream. It also sparked my love for literature.

As I grew, my love for stories bloomed. Many evenings were spent reading poetry and classic literature. In my studies I realized the gift of storytelling in each and every one of us. Each book and poem was an invitation to search the author's hopes and dreams. Each page became a challenge to find my own voice to share.

A few summers ago when I went home to visit family, I was overjoyed to see that the joy of storytelling had been passed down to my niece and nephew. I spent hours listening to them. I heard about their joys, concerns, and hopes. It was nice to see them so willing to share their life with me. The best moment was when I stayed overnight at their house for a sleepover. We are all story tellers. When we let others into our lives we are sharing our story. The other day I came across a confirmation video focused on the art of storytelling. shared by word of mouth from generation to generation. Much of what has molded us as Christians has been formed from faith stories shared by family and friends.

Our faith story is a call to action. In Luke 12:32-40, we are encouraged to live our story for others to see. In verses 35 and 36 Jesus tells us: "Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks." God wants the Good News to be shared! The Bible is not simply a book of literature that you read and then put back on the shelf to collect dust. Our call is to live this good book for other to witness! As children of God, our story matters. It is a testimony of how we love God. Also, our story is told in more than words. In many instances, it is our actions that open hearts to Jesus. Think back to the people who have influenced your life. Was it words that they spoke that molded you or was it their actions or way of living that made the difference.

God gives us a voice for a reason. Each day we write a new chapter of our story. Jesus tells us in Luke 12: 32 & 34:

"Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

I can't wait to turn the page and see what God has in store for us next!

Timothy D. Price, a native of Goldsboro, NC, has a vast musical background. He began studying piano at an early age with Anita Poland, then organ with Marshalle Lewis. He is a graduate of East Carolina University with degrees in Sacred Music and Organ Performance. He studied organ with Janette Fishell, Colin Andrews, and Andrew Scanlon; piano with Henry Doskey and Keiko Sekino; harpsichord with John O'Brien; voice with Louise Toppin; and conducting with Daniel Bara and Al Sturgis. Timothy has traveled throughout New England playing our country's finest instruments in addition to the

organs of many renowned cathedrals in Germany, France, Spain, and England. He has served as Director of the Music Ministry at Pine Forest United Methodist Church (Goldsboro) and First Baptist Church (Kinston), Principal Organist at The Memorial Baptist Church in Greenville, and as Director of Music at First Christian Church in Farmville, NC. Timothy is an experienced handbell ringer and has performed with The Raleigh Ringers. He recently completed a Master's Degree in Elementary Education at East Carolina University and teaches fourth grade at Hodges Manor Elementary School.

"Buy a part, be a part" of clean water project in Guatemala

Installing a Living Waters for the World water purification system takes more than pumps and filters. We also need crayons, scissors, markers and a multitude of materials to teach people how to use the purified water and why they need it.

While your LWW team is ordering system parts from a Guatemalan vendor, we're also busy amassing supplies to teach health and spiritual lessons when we return to Guatemala this fall.

One of the ways you can help provide clean water is to "buy a part, be a part."

Please consider donating:

- —A box of crayons for coloring pictures to help reinforce the need for clean water.
 - Construction paper for colorful daisy chains for the celebration.
 - Paints or foam brushes for handprint banners.
- Money to help pay for a \$340 instructional manual in Spanish and other expensive items that must be ordered.

The health and spiritual educators will use these materials and more in three days of classes. In early August, we'll post a list of materials you can donate. Please see the specifications of what is needed.

In November, Nancy Cisco, Skip Irby, Mary Ann Saunders, Rob Saunders, Jack Stoughton and Susie Stoughton will facilitate the installation of a reverse osmosis softener (ROS) system at El Tule, a nutrition training center in northeastern Guatemala. The project - SPC's fourth installation - will be Living Waters for the World's first ROS system in

Guatemala. LWW's standard water purification system could not adequately treat the water, so **Rob** and **Jack** received additional training in April to learn about ROS installation.


