Session I — *Edmarc Children's Hospice*



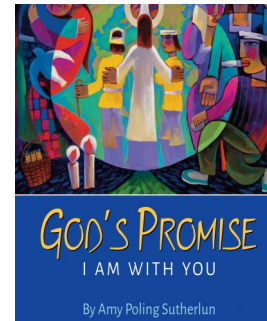

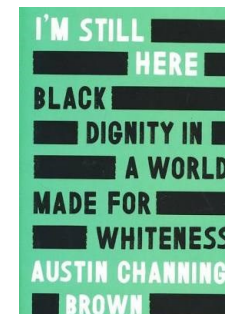
Session III — *God's Promise: I am With You—Horizon's 2018-2019 Bible Study*
