What words can we use to explain our gratitude to our God who has given us everything we need and more?

What can we do to show God how much we appreciate him?

This month starts our season of Giving. During our Thanksgiving meal we celebrate the blessings of a bountiful harvest by sharing our good fortune with those we love. Throughout our holiday season, is traditional to reach out to others with well wishes and gifts from the heart. Whether it be a Christmas card or a box of holiday cookies, it is important to let friends know how much we love them. Ella Wheeler Wilcox states, "For here lies the pleasures of living: In taking God's bounties and giving the gifts back again." So, how do you respond to a kind gesture from a friend? 

Lions, leopards and rhinos in their natural habitat will be the focus of our first "Lunch and Learn" series after worship on Sunday, Nov. 13, 2022. Also in the spotlight will be antelopes, elephants and giraffes as well as zebras sporting their black and white striped coats, flamingos standing on one leg and a grand diversity of other mammals and birds.



Nancy Cisco will be our tour guide, armed with pictures and videos of her African safari this past summer. She will delight us with tales of the 11-day trek she and her sister-in-law made through Kenya and Tanzania in July.

Nancy will take us through the Serengeti, home of some of East Africa's large game areas and famous for its abundant large predators. We'll view African leopards and spotted hyenas and hope to catch a glimpse of the swift running East African cheetah. We'll enjoy lunch first, compliments of **Breena Branham** and the deacons. There will be barbecued chicken, green beans, mac-and-cheese, salad and rolls. The lunch will celebrate the culmination of our annual Stewardship season.
