A Vase Comes Full Circle

If you've walked through the Narthex recently, you might have seen a large urn-shaped vase sitting on the sideboard. Its rounded, ivory-colored surface is covered with handprints in joyful primary colors. Surely, there is a story about this new piece of art?

Indeed there is! The vase was donated by Charles Dawson, brother of Maryanne Persons. Mr. Dawson visits Suffolk Presbyterian occasionally and had learned about the church's connection with Edmarc Hospice for Children. As a resident of Old Towne Portsmouth, he would pass the Edmarc building on daily walks and runs. While attending the Gosport Festival one spring, he saw the vase and felt a connection. His sentimental purchase was displayed in his home on Court Street and has now come home to SPC.

An inquiry to Deborah Sitzer-Brame, Executive Director of Edmarc, brought the following reply: "Oh, this brings back so many wonderful memories! The names (on the bottom) are of the two artists that pulled it all together - pottery, glazing and firing it. The little hands are from some of the Edmarc children from the Easter Party that year."

Next time you walk by the vase, take a moment to appreciate the impact Edmarc and the congregation of Suffolk Presbyterian Church have had on the broader community. From a kernel of an idea to fill a need in Suffolk, the organization has grown into a broader medical initiative to serve children and families throughout Hampton Roads and the Peninsula. Those little handprints represent the many who have had their journey eased through compassionate at-home care, improved medical treatment, and supportive bereavement programs. God is at work in the world, and we are his hands. Those handprints remind us that we can continue to touch the lives of others.











