Building a Legacy

I'd like to share with you an exciting new ministry opportunity our congregation has been invited to take part in. Over the past couple of months, Haden, one of our SPC youth, and I have taken part in an ecumenical youth group with Main Street UMC, Suffolk Christian Church, and St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Kids from around the city have joined together to make possible that which would be impossible on our own. It has been fun making new friends, taking part in pizza parties, and participating in interesting new games and activities. During each gathering, the group leaders have challenged the youth to consider what their mission will be.

Last month the focus of our meeting involved food insecurity in our community. They were invited to participate in a computer program that had them pick a profession and then support a spouse and children for a month. Many were surprised how fast their pay check was spent on everyday needs. They also learned about the cost of living in Suffolk and what it takes to pay for rent, utilities, and food in their community. They were completely shocked to see just how much someone needs to earn each month to rent an apartment and make ends meet. At the end of the evening they listened to the story of the feeding of the 5000 from Matthew 15:29-39 and then talked about Jesus' message concerning sharing resources and caring for those in need. After a great deal of discussion they decided they wanted to start a mission to help the people of Suffolk access healthy food.

I am so excited about this opportunity for Haden and all the children participating in our new joint youth program. This group experience has already allowed our youth to not only have fun and find a place in the life of the church but has also begun to help them better understand how their love and hard work can form a lasting legacy to the community.

Here at SPC we are excited to support this new ministry and are looking for ways to help out the best we can. At our last 5th Sunday service in the narthex, we discussed what it means to be like Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and what we can do to care for Jesus' flock. We talked about all the ways we have supported our neighbors through mission and outreach projects. It is clear that our congregation has a heart for mission and an openness to share God's love in unique ways. During one of our worship activities we talked about ways we can extend our blessing to our friends and neighbors in Suffolk. One idea that was discussed was starting an outdoor, mini food pantry on our church property. Similar to the little sharing libraries you see around town, these "blessing boxes" would allow members of our community to share what they have and take what they need. The beauty of this program is that we can partner with other congregations to make "blessing boxes" available around the city of Suffolk as well as support a mission that is near and dear to the hearts of our youth. Hopefully, this gift of love will create a legacy that we all can be proud of.

The 2023–2024 PW/Horizons Bible study by author Olive Mahabir invites readers to consider Jesus, "the good shepherd" (Luke 10:15), who shared the Good News through sacred encounters with everyday people. The Gospel According to Luke and the book of the Acts of the Apostles, or Luke-Acts "one story in two parts, "demonstrate the unfolding of God's redemptive purposes in human history and present a distinctive perspective on the person and work of Jesus Christ. Written by Luke, a physician and traveling companion of Paul, the message to the early Christian community (and to us) is radical, inclusive, and hope-filled.

Olive Mahabir is Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care and Adult Spiritual Growth at Northminster Presbyterian Church in Roswell, Georgia. She was born in Trinidad and Tobago and served in the Diaconal Ministry of the Presbyterian Church in Trinidad. In church ministry for more than 20 years she has pastored churches in Michigan, Atlanta, and Jonesboro, Georgia. She's a graduate of St. Andrew's Theological College in Trinidad, the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, Drew University in Madison, New Jersey, and Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. Mark your calendars for lunch and a presentation by **Chris Johnson**, our multi-talented music director, as he relates first-hand accounts of life in Ukraine.

Bring a dish to share for the "Lunch & Learn" after worship on Sunday, June 11. A sign-up sheet will be available in the narthex to indicate what type of dish you will be bringing. Members of West End Baptist Church have been invited to join us for the covered-dish luncheon and program.

Chris Johnson, who teaches high school English at Windsor High School, will share highlights of his experiences in Ukraine as a teacher and administrator at the British International School in Kyiv, or Kiev, from 2014 to 2017.

The apartment where Chris lived in the Ukrainian capital has since been destroyed by the war Russia is waging against the country. He has been in contact with friends in the city, who have shared "war stories" with him.

In addition to playing the organ and piano for worship and directing the choir, Chris has also shared his floral and culinary skills with us - conducting a wreath making workshop, contributing fresh and permanent floral arrangements and making delicious dishes, including peanut butter cookies that melt in your mouth!

Come hear what Chris has to say about this war-torn country that many of us knew little about, including how to pronounce the name of the capital city, before Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022. Come learn about life in Ukraine before the attack and get a glimpse of what it is like today.
