A New Story

Indian American writer Deepak Chopra wrote in his book <u>Life and Death: the Burden of Proof:</u> "What keeps life fascinating is the constant creativity of the soul." As we start up again this fall there is a longing to make this time special. In the coming month we will resume Sunday School, Bible Studies, and evening Choir practice. We also look forward to upcoming events such as Trunk or Treat and Lunch and Learn. So, how might these activities and events be used to create new life in our church and enrich our faith journey? Also, how can creative hearts and minds help us grow in faith?

As a small church minister, I believe creativity can make or break a congregation. Creativity allows us to look at our faith from new perspectives. I remember going to a convocation years ago where the speaker introduced the book "Wreck This Journal" by Keri Smith. Each page gives an activity to do to help in the destruction of the book. For instance:

"Tie a string to the spine of this book. Swing wildly. Let it hit the walls".

"Place sticky things here. (honey, gum, syrup, glue, sucker, marshmallow)."

"Tear this page out. Put it in your pocket and put it in the wash. Place it back."

These activities may seem silly but they make a point. How often have you in good faith started to write a journal and then quit or lost interest.

This book shifts the focus to experiencing a journal in a new way. Instead of feeling bad because you forgot to write a daily entry, throw it in the freezer and move on. It also encourages you to take new risks and to get used to being a bit uncomfortable from time to time. I personally found day two very nerve wracking. As a lover of books, I was unable to go through with "cracking the spine" of my journal.

When we are called to discipleship, we are called to get out of our comfort zone. In Joshua 1:9 it states "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Creativity helps us to see God more clearly and experience God more deeply. Think of a Bible Study or a Sunday School class that has inspired you recently. How did it feel to see God in a new light? More importantly, what could it mean for us if we consider experiencing our story differently?

In the first Chapter of Genesis we are told that God is our creator and we are created in God's image. We are also taught that God gives us different gifts to use in our ministry. Each of us has an important role to play in our collective story. We were built to use creativity to celebrate and honor God. Considering this, what chapter might you be willing to add to the story of Suffolk Presbyterian Church?



Presbyterian Women Bible Study

Welcome back! All are welcome to join in our PW study "Sacred Encounters: The Power and Presence of Jesus Christ in Luke-Acts. The studies are scheduled monthly on the second Monday at 7 pm in the church library. Our first gathering for the fall will be on Monday, September 11th. Please see the information below about this year's study and author. Studies are available in the Narthex for \$10 but are not necessary for participation.

The 2023–2024 PW/Horizons Bible study by author Olive Mahabir invites readers to consider Jesus, "the good shepherd" (Luke 10:15), who shared the Good News through sacred encounters with everyday people. The Gospel According to Luke and the book of the Acts of the Apostles, or Luke-Acts "one story in two parts, "demonstrate the unfolding of God's redemptive purposes in human history and present a distinctive perspective on the person and work of Jesus Christ. Written by Luke, a physician and traveling companion of Paul, the message to the early Christian community (and to us) is radical, inclusive, and hope-filled.

Olive Mahabir is Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care and Adult Spiritual Growth at Northminster Presbyterian Church in Roswell, Georgia. She was born in Trinidad and Tobago and served in the Diaconal Ministry of the Presbyterian Church in Trinidad. In church ministry for more than 20 years she has pastored churches in Michigan, Atlanta, and Jonesboro, Georgia. She's a graduate of St. Andrew's Theological College in Trinidad, the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, Drew University in Madison, New Jersey, and Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. Olive enjoys visits to the beach, watching historical documentaries, and spending time with family.

Living Waters Fall Plant Sale

First of all, a huge thank you to all who have brightened your fall gardens with mums and pansies over the past years in support of SPC's Living Waters for the World mission. This fall, we will begin the plant sale fundraiser on Sunday, Sept. 10. A notable change is that **Curt Mackenzie** has graciously agreed to lead the plant sale activities while Jack and Susie are away.

As reported before, our LWW team will not be traveling to Guatemala but will continue to keep up with our clean water partners through email, Zoom meetings and financial assistance. Indeed, we continue to see God's hand at work as our brothers and sisters in Guatemala faithfully keep providing clean water in their communities. One exciting development is the restoration of our second system, installed in 2010 at the middle school in Estancia de la Virgen. The new principal's goal is to restore the system to provide clean water for children at the school. Because of your help, the donations and funds raised through our spring and fall sales will go a long way to make that restoration possible.

Since our first installation in 2008, SPC and our in-country partners and in-country staff have been working together with communities in the departments of El Progreso and Chiquimula, both located northeast of Guatemala City. We are inspired to meet the challenges of upgrading their operating standards and equipment as they seek mandated government health licensing. Last year, because of your support, our team was able to send \$6,500 for sustaining this mission work. Our challenge is to match that again and keep more clean water flowing!
