Deborah Stitzer-Brame, Executive Director of Edmarc, was recently recognized as Outstanding Nonprofit Leader by the Hampton Roads chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals. A crowd of nearly 400 attendees gave Debbie a standing ovation at the National Philanthropy Day luncheon and awards ceremony, indicative of the respect and admiration she has earned for her dedication to serving children with life-threatening illnesses. For 24 years, Debbie has been faithfully leading Edmarc with heart and compassion. The organization has assisted hundreds of children and will soon expand its programming to other parts of the state.
